

How to dial from the U.S. to Germany.

From a U.S. civilian phone to a German civilian number:

011+ 49(Germany country code)+**6371**(Ramstein civilian prefix)+**XXXXXX**(Remainder of the number) **011+49+6371+675432**

From a U.S. civilian phone to a Ramstein DSN:

This is a bit tricky. Suppose you wanted to call **DSN 480-6580** from your home phone. You would dial **011+49+6371+47+6580**. **480** is one the many DSN prefixes for Germany. To dial other DSN prefix's in Germany, replace the red digit's with the following numbers for the DSN number you want to call. ex: if you wanted to call **DSN 486-9876 in Landstuhl**, you would dial **011+49+6371+86+9876**

From a U.S DSN phone to a Germany DSN:

314(OCONUS DSN Prefix)+**XXX+XXXX**(The DSN Number).

Once you have arrived in Germany, and you want to dial a number from your on/offpost lodging.

From an onpost Guesthouse:

If you acquired onpost lodging at a guesthouse, your room phone should have DSN capabilities. However, each Guesthouse only has one DSN trunk, so it is often busy. Ask the front desk for the DSN access code, which is usually **88** or **8**, and just dial the DSN number. ex **88-480-6580**

To dial a civilian number ask the front desk for the Civilian access code, which is usually **99** or **9**. If for instance you wanted to call your sponsor whose number is **011+49+6371+987654**. This number assumes you are calling from the states, you need to make two small adjustments to dial this number locally. First drop the **011** and the **49**(Germany country code) from all numbers within Germany. Next add a **0** to all Civilian access code's and dial the remaining digits. The new number you would dial after the Civilian access code would be **06371+987654**. The **06371**(Civilian access code) is treated just like an area code throughout Germany. If you know that the number you are calling from contains the same digits, you do not have to use them when dialing a number, but it doesn't hurt to include them. Just dial the Civilian access code and then **987654** in this instance.

Now lets say you want to dial your sponsor's work on Ramstein at **DSN 480-6580**, and the DSN trunk is busy. Reference the DSN conversion chart above and convert the DSN prefix 480. After dialing the Civilian access code add **06371+47+6580**. Remember each DSN prefix has a different conversion number.

From an offpost German accommodations:

To dial a civilian number ask the front desk for the Civilian access code, which is usually a **0**. If for instance you wanted to call your sponsor whose number is **011+49+6371+987654**. This number assumes you are calling from the states, you need to make two small adjustments to dial this number locally. First drop the **011** and the **49**(Germany country code) from all numbers within Germany. Next add a **0** to all Civilian access code's and dial the remaining digits. The new number you would dial after the Civilian access code would be **06371+987654**. The **06371**(Civilian access code) is treated just like an area code throughout Germany. If you know that the number you are calling from contains the same digits, you do not have to use them when dialing a number, but it doesn't hurt to include them. Just dial the Civilian access code and then **987654** in this instance.

You do not have DSN access offpost and must use the DSN conversion chart above to call.. Ask the front desk for the outside access code, which is usually **0**. Now lets say you want to dial your sponsor's work on Ramstein at **DSN 480-6580**. Reference the DSN conversion chart above and convert the DSN prefix 480. After dialing the Civilian access code add **06371+47+6580**. Remember each DSN prefix has a different conversion number. The **06371**(Civilian access code) is treated just like an area code throughout Germany. If you know that the number you are calling from contains the same digits, you do not have to use them when dialing a number, but it doesn't hurt to include them. Just dial the Civilian access code and then **47+987654** in this instance.
